Bay Harbor Improvement Association Pavilion





We passed the city inspection on May 1 and are ready to welcome you and your guests to the building for our annual meeting on June 11 at 5PM. We will have a brief dedication ceremony, recognize those who were involved in the building's planning and construction, explain a simple set of rules and then enjoy ourselves with food, festivities, the annual meeting and a silent auction.

Even though we have a simple building, it is constructed to the latest hurricane codes and was therefore reasonably expensive. Accordingly, we are pleased to announce that any BHIA member who wishes to may purchase a commemorative plaque and display either their support for the pavilion or their remembrances of a loved one. A picture of the very first plaque is included at the end of this article. It commemorates one of the greatest friends of Bay Harbor ever: Randy Choate.


Bay Harbor Spring 2016 Fishing Report by Capt. Bill Hand



As expected, the heavy rains and fresh water run-off from the past few months has created some great conditions for fishing in West Bay. The bay and the canals in Bay Harbor are full of Menhaden (Pogies) and the Specks and Reds are getting plenty to eat. Fishing has been just short of fantastic over the past few weeks and the fish are fat and healthy. There is still a lack of Redfish other than some over size Bull Reds that are schooling under birds out in the middle of the bay on some days.

There are also plenty of birds following schools of mostly small Specks and Gafftop all over the west end of the bay. It is only a matter of a few weeks before we should start to see a load of Sand Trout.





The only downside of fishing this time of year is trying to get a window of good weather on the days that you can be down here to fish. Over the past two months that has been about two good days per week following passing fronts and stormy weather. As we get into summer our weather patterns usually stabilize and we have calm mornings and the SE wind comes up in the afternoon.



Now is the time to get out there and get with the action before our "Africa Hot" weather settles in for the long hot summer.
