

Have you seen it?! Have you driven by and noticed BHIA's newest addition?! If not, then you need to take a drive down to the marina to see our new pavilion. For years and years the need for a pavilion has been discussed and finally it has been accomplished.

It had become a pain at each annual meeting to erect two huge tents, place chairs and tables inside and then remove all the chairs and tables and take down the tents after the meeting. The process always required time and effort from volunteers which could not always be found at the time that we needed them. Now, thanks to your executive board AND YOUR MEMBERSHIP IN THE ASSOCIATION, we have a great meeting place.

The building of the pavilion was a strenuous process dealing with the requirements of the City of Galveston and the permit process. But, with the assistance of several board members handling the permitting requirements and attending several meetings with city officials, we are nearing the end of the process.

Please understand that the building of the pavilion was completed in part by volunteers from the community. The engineer drawings and the actual construction was completed at a minimum cost due to different individuals donating their time, effort and even resources to get the job done at a minimum cost.

## Bay Harbor Winter 2016 Fishing Report by Capt. Bill Hand

Not much fishing activity to report this time of year. Because of the strong north and northwest winds, we have had some extreme low tides for the last few weeks. It has been a while since I remember these sustained low tides. This low water makes running a boat in West Bay very dangerous. There are many people who can't even get out of Bay Harbor because the boat channel is silted in out near the end of the bird island. If you try, be very careful.




If you get out after it warms up a little and catch a moving tide, you can still catch a few Specks, Reds and Flounder. You need to find an area with bait fish that are active. The water temperature has been in the mid 50's. Most fish are pretty lethargic in this cold water, but they still have to eat. When the water warms to the mid 60's they will be more active and feed more often. That should happen within the next few weeks if we continue to get the warm weather and bright sunlight.


Sometimes in early April, birds will start working just west of Jamaica Beach. It all depends on the bait movement, but that area seems to turn on first. There is a lot of juvenile baitfish in the canals now that should be moving into the bay soon. I have also seen a few Specks working around the canal lights in the past week.

#### Parking at the Boat Launch

We wish to remind community members that parking overnight at the boat launch or pavilion area is strictly prohibited. We welcome parking during the day on any day of the week. In the past we have had vehicles, trailers, machinery, etc. left overnight in the area of the boat launch which is in violation of the BHIA restrictions.

There is currently a boat trailer parked with no license plate affixed. Please understand the City of Galveston said all we need to do is call them and they will have the vehicle, trailer, machinery, etc. towed away. We really don't want to go through that process as we would rather work with our community members. If there were an identifying license plate on the trailer then we could contact the community member without getting the city involved.

Please be mindful of the parking restrictions at the Boat Launch and Pavilion areas.
