Winter in Bay Harbor

Bay Harbor Habitat Restoration Project

Up date report as of January 28, 2011

A meeting was held with Gahagan & Bryant Associates on April 29, 2010 to open bids for construction of the habitat project. The Notice of Award/Contract was signed June 16, 2010 with JND Thomas Co. and a pre-construction meeting was held at the offices of GBA on August 3, 2010.

Weekly construction summary reports were provided by GBA summarized below:

Sept 12-18: Mobilization to the site began on august 22, 2010 and notice

to proceed was given on September 7. Silt fencing was in-

stalled; footprint stakes

were installed; geo-tubes were being filled.

Sept 19-25: Filling of geo-tubes continued

Sept 26-Oct 2: Channel marker pilings installed; continue filling geo-tubes

Oct 3-9: Dredge work continued with discharge to island pad

Oct 10-16: Dredge work continued discharge to island and geo-tubes

Oct 17-23: Installation and filling of geo-tubes near completion

Oct 25-31: Discharge continued on the pad

Nov 1-7: Channel depth being worked.

Nov 8-14: Discharge continues to pad

Nov 15-21: Not working due to bad weather

Nov 28-Dec 4: Discharge restarted and continued to pad

Dec 5 - Dec 11: Island restoration is to grade. Areas continue to be filled

Dec 19 - Dec 25: Deficiencies addressed Dec 12-18. Work will be done

For construction information the project was declared complete as of December 21, 2010.

An inspection committee from Galveston Bay Foundation toured the site on Tuesday, January 11 and gave reports of some repairs and completion work to be done. This is being addressed with the

engineers and contractor. GBA will make sure all work is completed before releasing the contractor.

Galveston Bay Foundation and US Fish & Wildlife Services will make arrangements to plant native vegetation on the island which will include many residents and neighboring volunteers and the Boy Scouts of America. Sample vegetation has been planted for testing. At the time of the planting Bay Harbor will hold a fund raiser to prepare for monitoring and continued expenses.

Hello to our Bay Harbor friends and neighbors. Our next Garden Club meeting is quickly approaching. Originally I had planned to find a speaker for our meeting, but then I realized that something very appropriate for us was already in the planning stages.

I'm sure that all of you are familiar with the Island Restoration that was completed recently. Here's a copy of the email that Bill sent out at the end of January.

"I just wanted to update everyone and give you a heads up on our plans for planting on our restored island. We are coordinating with the Galveston Bay Foundation to supply the plants and assistance. We will need to complete this project before 1 March 2011 because the birds will be starting to nest. If we do not get this project done before that date, we will have to wait until September when the birds leave the island. As of now, we are looking at either 19 or 26 February 2011 for the project.

As soon as we have a firm date and time, we will advise every one of the details. I just wanted to give everyone a little lead time and give you and update. Hopefully we can get most of the planting done next month and add to it in September."

So, rather that have a formal meeting, I am suggesting that we all put on our gardening clothes and shoes and help out with the planting. The date (February 19 or 26) is up in the air right now. We will inform you of the exact date and time as soon as possible.

Bay Harbor Winter 2011 Fishing Report by Capt. Bill Hand

We have had a second consecutive winter of cold and generally nasty weather. The tides have been extremely low and temperatures well below normal for Galveston Island. I am not sure about all of this "Global Warming" and "Rising Sea Level" information that we hear on the news. I guess time will tell if this is just another cycle of cold weather that we have seen before, or if there is something to this "Climate Change" thing. There is not much fishing action to report. The water temperature has been around 54 degrees for a while now and that along with extremely low tides makes finding fish difficult. The water level in Bay Harbor canals has been very low and crystal clear on most days. I have not observed any fish in the canals other than very small minnows and an occasional mullet.

A few weeks ago, on one of those rare sunny warm days, I went to the beach down by the water tower and caught about 20 nice whiting on fresh dead shrimp. The trick to catching whiting on the beach this time of year is to have some fresh dead shrimp and fish on an incoming tide when the water starts to move up on the beach. Most of the fish are in the first gut and you don't even need to wade out to cast.

I have seen photos of some nice specks and had some reports from the Confederate Reef area. Most of those specks were caught by kayakers after dark during some miserable weather conditions. I am just not that mad at the fish to tolerate those conditions anymore.

If you venture out on the water during the winter, it is a good idea to let someone know where you plan to fish. Emergencies on the water during the winter can be life threatening and hypothermia is a serious problem in this area during the winter. If you are in the water without the proper protective clothing you can die. You should have a plan and phone numbers of a couple of people that you can call if you break down. It is no fun to spend the night out on the bay on a cold winter night. I can't over emphasize the importance of having a VHF Marine Radio in addition to your cell phone. Always carry rain gear and extra dry clothes with you. Unless you have a life threatening emergency, the Coast Guard will not come to your rescue.

I know that some folks are probably wondering about the cold weather and any possible fish kills in our area. I believe that any fish kill we may have had was very minor. Because of all of the cold weather and low tides that we had in December before the hard freezes of the past few weeks, most of the trout and reds had been acclimated and found deep holes to avoid the extreme temperatures.

Tight lines and be careful out there on the water.



Excerpts from the Saga of Bay Harbor by Roberta Christensen

1947 - Early stages of Bay Harbor

Embryonic stages of the Bay Harbor Addition began to form when Harry Melcer made a down payment of \$6,000 on 220 acres on West Beach of Galveston Island to C. E. Nelson and other parties September 22, 1947. The said 220 acres located in Division 1 of Survey 13 of the Hall Jones Subdivision on the westerly part of Galveston Isle of Abstract. No. 121, Patent No. 1, Volume 1, dated November 28, 1840. Mr. R. E. Smith paid \$30,000 on May 22, 1954, making the total cost of \$36,000 for the 220 acres.

1962 - The beginning stages of our marina area

O. J. Tauber, president, cited accomplishments of the Improvement Association at a Property Owner's meeting in Bill Bennett's Grill in Houston on September 26, 1962, then turned the meeting over to Charles N. Royds who called for a standing ovation to the committee which had donated time, labor, and money to correcting the ravages of "Carla," with maintenance funds paid by a greater part of the property owners. They could ask for no help from the County this would automatically open the addition to the public. It was voted to issue "Bay Harbor" stickers for autos of stockholders, to campaign for ALL property owners to pay the maintenance fee, to construct a launching ramp of concrete and install channel markers restrict swimming to certain areas to avoid accidents, and establish a regular program of road maintenance as the First Priority.

Dredging the turning basin and building a bulkhead was approved as a second priority as was fencing and shelling the 200 by 200 foot area designated at the turning basin for Property Owners' Parking.
