#### The Prez Says

It has been a slow winter but thank heaven it's not been a freezing one. The citrus trees are in bloom already and the grass is greening up letting us know to get the lawn mower in shape for another great spring. It has been written February 14th is the date to begin cutting back those plants which require such an activity. Roses especially are ready to be pruned on or about February 14th...I always thought it was interesting that we cut back roses on Valentine's Day. The truth of the matter is plants should be cut back after the last freeze and before new growth begins.

#### Reasons for Pruning:

- to maintain plant health
- to improve the quality of flowers, fruit, foliage or stems
- to restrict growth

most plants is during late

winter or early spring before growth begins. There are exceptions to this rule, and they will be noted under the discussion of the specific plant groups. The least desirable time is immediately after new growth develops in the spring. A great amount of food stored in roots and stems is used in developing new growth. This food should be replaced by new foliage before it is removed; if not, considerable dwarfing of the plant may occur. This is a common problem encountered in pruning.

A big step has been taken by your Board in that Bay Harbor Improvement Association will be operating with a prepared budget for the first time in history. A prepared budget will assist the organization to be more fiscally responsible. Many thanks go to Pam Williams, Gail Choate and Mark Bloom for some very intense and detailed planning. #### Transition of the Restoration Project

This edition of the Heron marks the transition of the marsh restoration project to Phil Martin from Betsy Redfield. Betsy has shepherded this project for over six years now, seeing it from inception to the actual completion of a newly dredged channel from the marina into the bay and the more than tripling of the nesting habitat on Bird Island and an equivalent increase in the wetlands area buffering the island. Our hats are off to Betsy for this incredible accomplishment.

Looking forward, Phil will be picking up the challenge of seeing to it that we are prepared in the future for additional dredging of the channel as needed, and looking for opportunities to enhance the habitat area for the benefit of the birds and all members of the Bay Harbor community. Below is a Project 'to-do list' that will provide an idea of the kind of activities that will need continued community support going forward to derive the maximum benefit for all from this effort.

- Protect the Habitat Bank account. Let's not let any of these funds get comingled into the general account. We will need all these funds and MORE to maintain the project in the future. The lease with the Texas General Land Office has eight years remaining at \$3,366/ year.
- 2. Contact Phil Smith of Galveston Bay Foundation (psmith@galvbay.org) (281-332-2281) to ask about any spring planting of vegetation on the island.
- 3. The project (dredging) was completed December 2010. Contact Gahagan & Bryant to request them to continue working with Bay Harbor in the future. Dana Cheney (<a href="https://doi.org/10.108/journal.com/">DLCHENEY@GBA-INC.COM</a>) (832-377-4800 cell/832-518-2112 off)
  - A. Survey timing for maintenance dredging
  - B. Apply for permit with CORPS for maintenance dredging
  - C. Review possibility of placing the material on the island and contact TGLO.
- 4. Contact Scott Williams of US Fish & Wildlife (<u>Scott\_Williams@fws.gov</u>) (281-286-8282) to ask that he continue to work with Bay Harbor re support and planting.
- 5. Contact Kristopher Benson of NOAA (<u>Kristopher.Benson@noaa.gov</u>) (409-766-3699) to ask that he continue to work with Bay Harbor re applications for funds.
- 6. Prepare a fundraising schedule. We will need to continue to raise funds, so set out some fundraising events to keep the project in front of our community. The maintenance dredge could cost \$40,000 50,000. This may not be for three plus years, but it takes a lot of pushing and begging to raise money.

## Bay Harbor Winter 2012 Fishing Report by Capt. Bill Hand

It is almost the middle of February and so far we have had a very unusual winter fishing season. With a couple of exceptions we have had one of the mildest winters in a while. This mild weather and some much needed rain created a situation for some outstanding fishing. For the most part, the fish in West Bay have stayed



in the same areas they were feeding in during the fall. I have been closely monitoring the water temperatures at the weather station and tide gauge at San Luis Pass. The water temperatures have stayed in the low 60sF to middle 50sF all winter. These moderate water temperatures have been holding plenty of Redfish and Speckled Trout in three to five feet of water over scattered shell. Without giving up too much information, I will tell you that you can see the place that we are catching most of our fish from the boat ramp here in

Bay Harbor. One thing that has been a small problem is the low tides that are common in the winter. You really have to pick your fishing time and for the most part, that has been on a flood tide in the afternoon, right up to sundown. You also need to be very careful running a boat in the low water to keep from doing some significant damage to your outboards lower unit.

My favorite fishing rig for this winter has been a "Cajun Thunder" popping cork with a 18 to 20 inch 20lb mono leader attached to a 1/8 oz. lead head jig. We have

had great success using the three inch Pearl White and New Penny Gulp Shrimp. In the winter you need to slow down your retrieve and let your lure set still for a few seconds after popping the cork. This type of rig lets your lure fish near the bottom without constantly getting hung on oyster shell. We have also been picking up a few nice Flounder using this tactic. We have been making long drifts and when you hook a fish, mark the spot on your GPS and drift that track again. After a while, you will see a pattern and you can go back over the productive areas.

Unless we have some big changes in our weather pattern, spring fishing should be excellent. With the rain flushing out the marsh, the marshes should produce a bumper crop of shrimp and bait fish. That should lead to some bird chasing action as early as late April or May, so get ready! Now is the time to run your boat engine for a while and put new line on your reels.

As I have stated many times, fishing success in West Bay is all about moving water and finding the bait fish. If you can do that, you can almost always catch fish.

Tight lines and be careful out there on the water.
