# Bay Harbor Habitat Restoration Project Report May 2009

Representatives from Bay Harbor attended an outreach meeting at the Galveston County Courthouse on April 23rd sponsored by the Texas General Land Office to facilitate familiarity with the Coastal Erosion Planning and Response Act (CEPRA). Thomas Durnin, and Ray Newby, Coastal Planner, Stewardship, & Resources for the Texas General Land Office, put on an excellent presentation regarding the application for funding for qualified projects. This additional information was incorporated in the current application that Bay Harbor will submit in the amount of \$225,000 within the next month. In January we met with Dennis Rocha of the Texas General Land Office who encouraged our submitting an application at this increased amount to meet our required construction costs. Dennis estimates the total cost of the project to be \$450,000. We continue to need matching private funds of at least \$80,000.

We will also be submitting an application to the US Army Corps of Engineers Estuary Restoration Act (ERA) in the amount of \$50,000 and another application is being submitted to The Southeast Aquatic Resource Partnership/NOAA (SARP) in the amount of \$25,000. Kristopher Benson of NOAA has been very helpful in notifying us of these funding sources and offered his assistance in reviewing our applications.

We were asked by Jeri Kinnear of Coastal Beach & Bay Foundation, to assist a graduate student from Texas A&M in developing guidelines for habitat restoration projects like our Bay Harbor Project. At the meeting of April  $23^{\rm rd}$ , Dr. Thomas Linton of Texas A&M met with us and discussed this great opportunity. We will be able to recap the steps we have taken to develop our project and seek funding and use the student's talents for monitoring and recording our progress.

#### DIVISIONS

Small Fry (Ages under 10) - Entry Fee \$5.00 Junior (Ages 11-16) - Entry Fee \$5.00 Adult (17 and Over) - Entry Fee \$10.00

#### Fish that are eligible for a prize:

- Gafftop (14" no limit)
- Redfish (20" to 28" no tagged Redfish)
- Speckled Trout (15" 25", 1 oversize)
- Sheephead (14" no limit)
- Flounder (14" no limit)
- Drum, black (14" 30")
- Shark (24" no limit)
- Sand Trout
- Croaker
- Whiting
- Spadefish

#### RULES / REGULATIONS:

- 1. All participants must check in at the registration table on Friday evening between 5 & 7 pm at the Bay Harbor Marina or Saturday morning between 6:30 & 8:00 am at the Bay Harbor Marina. All fishing shall be in the West Galveston Bay complex or West Beach.
- 2. All fishing must comply with all Texas Parks and Wildlife rules and regulations.
- 3. All winning fish shall be determined by weight.
- 4. In the event of a tie, length will determine the winner.
- 5. All fish entered into competition must have been caught by an entrant and weighed at Bay Harbor.
- 6. No transfer of fish between tournaments entrants will be allowed. No non- entrants will be able to fish with tournament entrants during competition.
- 7. No fish will be weighed in if the tournament entrant is not in the weigh-in line by 2:00 p.m. on Saturday May 23, 2009.
- 8. No frozen, altered, gutted, spoiled, or mutilated fish will eligible for entry. All fish must be in edible condition.
- 9. Fish that have a minimum and maximum size limit will be disqualified if, in the judge's opinion, the head or tail have been cut or altered. Upon entry, fish will be marked by removal of 1 fin.

The decision of the tournament judges is final.

PLEASE KEEP IN MIND THAT THE MAIN PURPOSE OF THIS FISHING RODEO IS TO HAVE SOME FUN WITH YOUR FAMILY AND NEIGHBORS IN BAY HARBOR. PLEASE HAVE FUN BUT DON'T GET TOO SERIOUS ABOUT WINNING AND ALWAYS THINK SAFETY FIRST.

NO ALCOHOL WILL BE ALLOWED DURING THE HOURS OF THE TOURNAMENT.

### A few thoughts about our Bay Harbor Island

Please be careful, especially this time of year, if you see a need to walk on the small shell island behind Bay Harbor. It is covered with nesting shorebirds, many of which lay their eggs on top of the shells on the island. Please consider staying off this island and reminding children of the damage that can happen if they walk around or play on the island. It is against state and federal law to disturb these nesting birds, but beyond the law it just makes good sense to take care of the treasures that we have here in Bay Harbor. There are very few island neighborhoods that have this type of habitat right in their backyards.

### Bay Harbor Spring Fishing Report by Capt. Bill Hand

The tides of spring are on the rise. After several months of extremely low water we are finally getting some good tide exchange in the bay. As a result the bay is loaded with small menhaden. Just go out in the bay any afternoon on a strong tide and you will see pelicans from Bay Harbor all the way to San Luis Pass diving into large schools of these menhaden and scavenger sea gulls picking up the scraps. Because of our recent heavy rains the freshwater inflow into the marshes has been exceptional. This high volume freshwater inflow is something that we have not had for the last couple of years and it should provide some excellent habitat in our surrounding estuaries.

During the past couple of months I have been using fresh dead shrimp to catch plenty of "pan fish" like whiting and croaker. In my opinion it is hard to beat these two when it comes to fried fish. The small fillets fry up crisp and are extra good when they hit the frying pan shortly after they are caught. If you fish around those diving pelicans you should have no problem catching some nice gaff top. I have been on again, off again when it comes to catching and cleaning gaff top. Recently I perfected a new technique using my electric knife to clean gaff top and eliminate those big blood lines near the skin. I am also able to clean them now without worrying about the need for a trip to the emergency room.

With the water temperature in the bay running in the low 70s and with all bait in the bay, the specks should begin schooling up any day now and start some bird action in our area and to the east near Jamaica Beach. There have been lots of menhaden around the green lights in the canals along with some specks and reds. I am usually way too tired to fish the lights during the night, but my guess is that if you had some live shrimp, you could do some good. The Rusty Hook has had some good live shrimp for the past few weeks.

It is time to get your boat and fishing equipment ready because fishing is about to break wide open and we need to be ready. When you get a chance to get out on the water, remember to use fresh gas in your boat. I highly recommend using the ethanol type fuel stabilizer so that you can avoid breakdowns.

Tight lines and be careful out there on the water.




