

Heavy Bulk Trash Pick-up

Please get the word out so that we don't have trash collecting along the streets in the neighborhood. You must call in a request or the heavy bulk trash will not be collected. If you have a construction project, you or your contractor must remove the material. The City of Galveston will not pick up construction materials and they will cause an unsightly mess for weeks setting on the side of the street.

To schedule a bulk trash pickup please call (409) 797-3630. City collection crews will only visit pre-scheduled locations to cart away

bulk items like white goods, furniture, appliances & brush. All on-demand requests received by 3:00 p.m. will be scheduled for pick-up within 24-hours. Friday requests will be scheduled for the following Monday. The city has been doing a pretty good job of this, but you must call it in for them to take action.

Our Bay Harbor Bird Island

The many granting agencies and others who donated time and funds to our channel dredging and island restoration project never intended for our restored island to be a playground for the neighborhood or the public. We got those funds so that we could dredge our canal and use the dredge material to build a habitat for wildlife and shorebirds. I am not sure that everyone knows that fact. That was our main "selling point" and if we do not take care of this resource it is very unlikely that we will ever be able to get any of those grants in the future. The U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service is monitoring the island and based on what has been happening out there over the past several weekends I do not think they would be happy. I don't think that anyone would knowingly disturb the nesting birds on the island, but when you set foot on the island, you are doing just that. PLEASE inform your kids, friends and neighbors just how important it is that we stay completely off the island during the nesting season from the end of February through August. It may already too late this season to protect those birds, but hopefully with some education we can start off next season on a more

Two plantings of native smooth cord grass and mangrove were held February 26 and March 8th. Birds are nesting so please stay off the island. Final reports for the National Fish & Wildlife Foundation and National Association of Counties were submitted. When accepted, we will receive our reimbursements. These funds will cover remaining invoices. A summary of accounting will be prepared for the Board of Directors to review and for posting on our website.

Bay Harbor Spring 2011 Fishing Report by Capt. Bill Hand

The spring high tides and the winds of April are here. I think we would all like to see some "April Showers". The water temperature at the San Luis Pass weather station was 83 degrees this morning and is warming up with each passing day. Strong high tides are flushing the bay, which is obvious by all of the Sargasso seaweed that is in the bay right now. The shorelines are loaded with mullet and menhaden and fishing should break wide open anytime. There is already lots of Gafftop schooling which is always a sure sign of spring. Before long, there will be Specks and Reds amongst those schooling Gafftop. I have already seen some pictures of nice Specks taken over the Easter weekend. If the wind would just give us a little break and if we could get a decent rain, this could be one of the best fishing seasons in a long time.

I am going to use the rest of this article to talk about how you can use some current technology to help make you a better angler. Many people have smart phones, like Blackberrys, Droids and iPhones with current and future fishing conditions at your finger tips. One of my favorite apps for iPhones is *Tide Graph 2.4.* I think it costs around \$1.99. It shows exactly where the tide is at a certain time and the rate of rise and fall. I frequently pull up the tides for San Luis Pass, Alligator Point and Jamaica Beach to get an idea as to tide conditions in our area. There are some free tide apps, but they don't have all the features you get with a paid version.

By accessing the internet, you open up a vast base of information on current and future weather conditions around the area. Some of my favorites are the following:




