Rob's margarita machine was emptied out with generous donations to the general fund and very successful raffle and silent auctions were coordinated by Jessie Bradshaw, Cathy Francis and Pat Gatlin that added over \$2,000 to the treasury. We owe many thanks to the neighbors and companies who donated the items. Cathy Francis presided over sales of Bay Harbor logo items which also contributed to the overall success of the event.

After a very positive discussion regarding the annual dues, the membership voted unanimously to increase the annual assessment from \$100 to \$150 per year. # Bay Harbor Habitat Restoration Project Report <u>August 2009</u> <u>Betsy Redfield</u>

## Habitat Restoration Project/Channel Dredging Fundraising Party to

be held Saturday, September 5<sup>th</sup> at 3702 Tradewinds starting at 6:30PM. Bring your check payable to Coastal Beach & Bay/Bay Harbor Project or Bay Harbor Habitat Project. We are making the big push to get the private funds needed for matching grants received from the Coastal Counties Restoration Initiative (\$50,000) and the National Fish & Wildlife Foundation (\$50,000) and to match the pending application to the Coastal Erosion Protection & Response Act (Texas General Land Office) (\$225,000). There will be people there to discuss the Project and answer questions. We will have snacks (fried fish, cheese, fruit, etc) and drinks (wine, margaritas, tea, etc).

Remember your donation may be tax deductible to CB&B. Donations over \$100 will be recognized with a signature tile at the Marina and donations over \$1,000 will receive a framed print of the Project watercolor works by Caroline Graham.

As soon as funds are raised, the engineer will make a post-Ike survey and review the final design plans. Then contracts for construction will be let and construction could start as early as March. We need our completion target date to be April 30, 2010 to avoid losing our grants.

Now is the time to donate. Thank all of you who have contributed, keep it coming.

The Cylinder Gardening Program has involved more than 100 schools in 8 school districts and worked with over 50,000 children in Harris County. He is a member of the Lone Star Chapter of the American Hibiscus Society, Camellia Society, The Harris County Master Gardeners Association, a former President of the Houston Area Outreach Coalition, Inc., and director of the Leadership Center. Glen received the Lifetime Achievement Award from the Harris Country Master Gardeners, the Outstanding Individual Master Gardener for the state of Texas in 1999, and the Gold Medal Award in 1999. He was nominated for the 1996 Governor's Volunteer Award. In recent years, Glen has been working on new curriculums such as Composting, Butterfly Gardening and Worm Composting.

### Bay Harbor Summer Fishing Report by Capt. Bill Hand

We are in the "Dog Days" of summer, but some cool weather and fall fishing is right around the corner. We have had a few outstanding days when the surf was green to the beach. There were lots of specks and some sharp toothed Spanish mackerel cutting off lures and stealing live shrimp. I have not fished the area around the bridge at San Luis Pass, but I have heard some good reports from that area. Live Croaker is usually a sure bet for that area and at times free lining large live shrimp will work equally as well. Just watch the weather and the tides for your best chance for success down at the Pass. There were some good reports from Bay Harbor residents fishing in the deep guts behind the pass when you could catch the tides right. Early morning on a moderate tide is best in that area and when the trout are hitting top water baits, it doesn't get much better.

June and July brought some pesky southwest wind which tends to keep the bay off color for days. We are finally starting to see a trend to a more southeasterly wind pattern which really helps clear the bay up. There has been fairly consistent action over the deep shell reefs in lower West Bay on Specks and all the Sand Trout that you want to bring home. I have been using pearl colored 3" Gulp Shrimp and that bait has been good all summer. Several residents have reported outstanding action on some nice Specks under their lights in the canals.

My advice for fall is to check the tide tables and get out in the lower bay with your binoculars and look for birds. I usually go by the tide predictions for Alligator Point and San Luis Pass. It is not unusual to see birds working all over the bay during moving tides. I have had my best luck chasing birds on the north side of the bay during a falling tide, and the south side during a rising tide. You should be able to find all the birds you need from just east of Sea Isle to the mouth of Chocolate Bay. Chocolate Bay will also produce lots of working birds, but it has been my experience that most of the specks in Chocolate Bay tend to be on the small side. Every fall I have had my best catches within two miles or so of the Bay Harbor boat ramp.




