Bay Harbor Habitat Restoration Project Report

Questions have floated around regarding the Bay Harbor Habitat Restoration Project. Below is an attempt to respond to them.

Why are there two financial accounts for the Project?

The Bay Harbor Restoration Account is set up for periodic donations for those who did not need /want/care about receiving a receipt for possible tax deductions. Also, it is important that Bay Harbor show funds for future maintenance and continued project activity. These funds are dedicated solely for the Restoration Project and cannot be moved/used for any other purpose. Donations to the Bay Harbor Restoration account cannot be refunded/returned. Funds donated remain donated.

The Coastal Beach & Bay Foundation is a 501©(3) non-profit organization. Bay Harbor is not a 501©(3) organization and would not qualify to receive Federal, County, State or other grants. By having CB&BF as our Financial Administrator, this qualifies CB&BF acting for Bay Harbor to receive grants from all sources. Donations to CB&BF may be tax deductible. Each donor is mailed a letter from CB&BF indicating the amount donated/received and the Project (Bay Harbor Habitat Restoration) to which the funds are designated. This letter is a receipt and may be presented to your tax consultant. As our Financial Administrator for the Bay Harbor Habitat Restoration Project they receive all grants to administer. Periodic reports are sent to each granting organization indicating project activity and expenditure of funds. When an invoice is received by Bay Harbor for the Project, it is sent to CB&BF for payment and a form is filled in to submit to the granting organization for reimbursement. Each granting organization has similar payment procedures. Again, donations given to CB&BF for the Bay Harbor Habitat Restoration Project are not refundable/returnable.

What happens to the funds if the project is not completed?

The Project WILL BE COMPLETED!!!!!. This is not a maybe let's do project. There will be delays and set-backs, but it will be completed. As to delays, we stand to lose grants from The Coastal Counties Restoration Initiative and the National Fish & Wildlife Foundation if we do not get the project started and get the funds activated to our Project before April 1, 2010. The amounts from these grants are not included in the total for the Bay Harbor Project, but are used as invoiced against. All privately donated funds will remain in the Bay Harbor Habitat Restoration Project account until they are used for the Project. We keep on going until the Project is completed.

What will the Project look like?

Please get a copy of our brochure. Please come by and see me at one of our fundraising parties to review the engineering drawings. The channel dredging will begin at the area just out from the marina where there is a "No Wake" sign. It does not involve the marina or the resident cannels. The dredged material will be pumped into geotexile tubes and placed around the eroding island and along the boater access side.



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These will serve as breakwaters and hold back additional dredged material (more dense sand & shell) placed and packed behind the tubes.

Bay Harbor Fishing Report by Capt. Bill Hand

As I sit writing my report this morning the tide is almost to the top of the bulkhead. That is not uncommon this time of year with the current moon cycle and a brisk East wind. I frequently talk about the importance of understanding the tides to improve your fishing success so here is a brief explanation of some of the terms we use when talking about tides.

When using tide tables for the Galveston Channel you need to add two hours to calculate the tide times for Bay Harbor. Tidal flow (direction) changes from East to West near Jamaica Beach which is generally the middle of West Bay. Tide tables are available at several locations on the internet and on the Weather Channel. There is also some very good software that will allow you to calculate specific tide times for specific locations along the bay. I use *Tides & Currents* by Nautical Software, Inc.

Tide: The vertical rise and fall of the surface of a body of water caused primarily by the differences in gravitational attraction of the moon, and to a lesser extent the sun, upon different parts of the earth when the positions of the moon and sun change with respect to the earth.

Spring Tide: The tidal effect of the sun and the moon acting in concert twice a month, when the sun, earth and moon are all in a straight line (full moon or new moon). The range of tide is larger than average.

Neap Tide: This opposite effect occurs when the moon is at right angles to the earth-sun line (first or last quarter). The range of tide is smaller than average.

Diurnal Tide: Only a single high and a single low during each tidal day; successive high and low waters do not vary by a great deal. Such tides occur, for example, in the Gulf of Mexico, Java Sea and in the Tonkin Gulf.

Some of our neighbors have been catching some very large Croaker this fall and the action on Redfish has been good on the beach as well as in the bay. The stocking efforts by Texas Parks and Wildlife are paying off. It is only a matter of time before we start seeing birds all over the bay working over Specks and Reds.

As a reminder, the new Flounder special regulation: Daily bag is 5 fish except for the pe-

riod Nov. 1-30 when the daily bag is 2 fish and flounder may be taken only by pole and line. Possession limit is equal to the daily bag

Tight lines and be careful out there on the water.




