As people say, "When it is cold in Galveston it is coooooolllllddddd." But, as many also hear, "A bad day in Galveston is better than a good day anywhere else."



Galveston Bay Foundation 2014 Fall Marsh Mania At Bay Harbor Habitat Island



Around 80 people showed up for the fall marsh planting on our well preserved island. Boats provided by the foundation and Bill Hand ferried adults and children to the island where for 3-4 hours they planted marsh grass. There was much good weather and many not so good mosquitoes. Afterwards, a nice box lunch provided by Subway was offered and door prizes were awarded.



Marsh Mania is the nationally-recognized, signature community-based wetlands restoration and education event of the Galveston Bay area. The goal of Marsh Mania is to involve local citizens in hands-on wetlands restoration activities while increasing their awareness and appreciation of wetland habitats and functions. In its fifteen years, Marsh Mania has involved more than 7,100 community volunteers in the restoration of over 202 acres of vital salt marsh habitat at 74 sites around Galveston Bay. ### Bay Harbor Fall 2014 Fishing Report

With cool mornings on the bay and beach, we can feel fall (and mosquitoes) in the air. The fall weather pattern usually brings light offshore winds in the morning and switch back to onshore by the afternoon, but, like the rest of the year, that has not been the case. We have been plagued with East and Northeast winds that have made fishing on the open bay difficult at times this fall. We have had very few days of our "normal" Southeast wind that clears the surf and the bay. When you can catch those few prime weather days, the fishing has been good. Strong North winds makes for very low tides and strong East winds make for very high tides, neither of which are good for fishing in West Bay.



The Redfish are starting to show up in the traditional areas of the bay and should be schooling under birds anytime, so take your binoculars and look for them along the south shoreline and mid-bay this time of year. Most of the time, these fish are borderline keepers. Remember the Redfish slot limit is 20 to 28 inches. In my opinion Redfish over 24 inches are not as good to eat as the smaller ones and I usually "CPR" them (catch, photograph and release).

For some reason the Speckled Trout population is not what is to be expected this time of year and in fact has not been normal all year, at least for this fisherman. We have caught some nice Specks and a few throw backs, but not any large numbers. Not even close to the limit of 10 per person. The limit from Sargent south is 5 per person.



As is usual for this time of year, there is a good crop of Sand Trout and there is no size or number limit on them. A great fish for a big fish fry.



Reports from the surf in front of Bay Harbor indicate some

nice keeper and oversize Redfish, plus good numbers of Whiting and Sand Trout. Live finger mullet seem to be the magic bait for the Reds, but fresh dead cut mullet will also work. Fresh dead shrimp wrapped on the hook work well for the Whiting and Sand Trout.

On a final note, the grass beds that were once common in all of West Bay years ago are starting to make a comeback on both the north and south shore lines of the bay.

Don't forget to take a jacket and rain gear with you this time of year. Even though it may still seem warm, hypothermia can be a life threating issue as winter approaches.
